Mr. Moyer received a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology from Dickinson College and a Master of Science degree in Environmental Engineering Sciences from the University of Florida. He has also completed post-graduate studies in Marine Biology at the University of Delaware College of Marine Studies and in Invertebrate Zoology and Evolution at the Wesleyan University in Middletown, Connecticut. Mr. Moyer is a Certified Environmental Professional and serves on the board of the Association of State Wetland Managers.

Mr. Moyer's areas of expertise include wetlands management, submerged lands management, coastal zone management, environmental impact analysis, pollution control, water quality certification, and estuarine resource protection. During the course of his career, he has conducted biological surveys in both fresh and estuarine waters and has managed state statutes and state programs that are for the protection of coastal resources. He has served as a member of the Governor's Task Force on Marine Recreation and the Governor's Task Force on the Inland Bays.
